## Reopening Status:

All Saint Andrew Parish buildings are **closed to the public**. The Archdiocese has granted Saint Andrew Parish the permission to hold Mass publically starting July 12, 2020 (*read more on page 4*).

Meanwhile, the parish staff is working remotely with periodic check-ins. If you need to make contact with the parish staff, please call 773-525-3016 and leave a message. Someone on staff will check voicemails every half hour from M-F 8:00am to 8:00pm and on Saturday and Sunday from 8:00am to 2:00pm.

## Additional Information about Parish Ministries

Saint Andrew Parish is adhering to the comprehensive guidelines set by the Archdiocese of Chicago for the reopening of our buildings for our ministries. These guidelines can be found at <https://www.archchicago.org/coronavirus/reopening>

Cardinal Cupich has already announced that Catholic Schools will reopen this Fall (August) and our faculty and staff are working hard to prepare for this opening.

Religious Education for students in grades K-8 and for the preparation for Confirmation will be done exclusively online through the month of January and potentially longer if necessary.

Parish meetings of up to 50 people will be able to take place soon and as noted above, the celebration of public Mass has begun on Sundays at 9:00am.

Please continue to follow strong social distancing guidelines and to help our city, state, country, and world overcome the devastating effects of this pandemic.

Dear Parish Family,

My husband and I recently returned from an anniversary trip. We decided the safest thing to do would be to camp, as there would be plenty of outdoor air and we could remain relatively isolated. We packed a spray bottle of bleach and some hand sanitizer along with our tent and sleeping bags, and off we went.

I have to say, planning this trip did a lot for my peace of mind. To be honest, "I like to plan" is a bit of an understatement. (My house is usually peppered with lists.) So it frustrated me, this feeling that the future was on hold because of COVID-19. But suddenly, here I was, booking campground reservations, buying supplies, packing the car - this was it! We were going somewhere!

Slowly, a sense of anxiety started stealing some of my joy. I tried to push the thoughts aside, but they kept coming. What if the Reopening Team encountered a problem? What if one of the youth group teens had a crisis? And I know our neighbor would water our garden, but for heaven's sake: what about all the WEEDS?

At the end of my vacation, I was in for a surprise. My email hadn't imploded, my voicemail was as empty as it was before we left, and the vegetable patch was three times its normal size. Yes, weeds had popped up here and there, but not only were things surviving, they were *thriving*.

The lesson I learned is this: Prepare your soil and let God do the rest. I wasn't going to do the garden an ounce of good by standing guard over it day and night. The parish staff and volunteers nearly had to throw me out of the church, telling me to take a break and let them handle it. Let's face it: my need for control was getting in the way of witnessing God's work in the people around me.

I had to let go, to trust that I could rest in God's huge hands for a while. And don't you know it... the whole world's in those hands.


## Vacation Bible School - July 27 -31, 2020

# Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families

## Decoding Christian Symbols

You may have seen one or two of these symbols before, but have you ever wondered what they mean? Take a moment to find out!



Alpha and Omega are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, and represent the beginning and the end (just as one might say, “from A to Z”). In Revelation 22:13, Christ refers to himself as the Alpha and Omega, the first and last of all creation.



Crossed keys are a pair of keys that overlap and interlock, creating an "X." In the Bible, Jesus gives these “keys of heaven” to St. Peter (Matthew 16:19). It’s not unusual to see this symbol in ecclesiastical heraldry or papal coats of arms.



The Chi-Ro cross is another symbol that takes its meaning from the Greek alphabet. In Greek, the symbol “X” stands for “CH,” while the symbol “P” stands for “R.” These letters are an abbreviation of “Christ,” and so appear frequently on tabernacles.



The Marian cross is a combination of the letter “M” and a cross. It represents Mary’s presence at the foot of the cross where Jesus died. You can find this image on the Miraculous Medal as well as Pope John Paul II’s coat of arms.

You don’t have to search far and wide to find these symbols, either! Look closely and you’ll see each of them in our church. Try to spot all four at an in-person mass this summer.
