- We continue to space seating so that a minimum distance is kept between attendees.
- We have returned the hymnals to the pews and once again invite parishioners to sing.

Pastoral Letter by David Heimann, Pastoral Associate

Dear Parish Family,

This weekend is tough for me. I find myself heartbroken and sad. When I first moved to Chicago just over 23 years ago, I was a loner in this big and wonderful city with only a few friends. I eventually found a full-time job working at Saint Ignatius Parish in Rogers Park which not only gave me employment, but it also provided the one thing that I most frequently cite my reason for being Catholic. It gave me a sense of community.

On Saturday, July 31, 2021, Saint Ignatius Parish will hold its final Mass and the parish itself will close permanently. This decision was made by Cardinal Cupich after consultations with numerous individuals at all levels of the Archdiocese in the process we know as Renew My Church. It is his belief that the best use of Archdiocesan resources is to close the parish and direct them to other areas.

I am writing not to say that the Cardinal Archbishop was right or wrong in his decision, but to acknowledge something about the results. I, and hundreds of other people, are experiencing a lot of grief to see something that we loved so dearly come to an end. Knowing that the institution will no longer be in use somehow tarnishes the memories made therein. What will happen to the buildings is unknown, but more importantly, what will happen to the people?

Saint Ignatius Parish was the first place that I heard someone say to me, "I don't know if I am Catholic, but I go to Saint Ignatius." I haven't heard the same words here at Saint Andrew Parish, but I recognize the same idea circulates among us. There are many of us who love the fellowship, love the people, love the things we do as a community at Saint Andrew.


But what would happen if Saint Andrew Parish were to close? We addressed the question hypothetically a few months back when we were going through Renew My Church ourselves. It is a reality that our neighbors to the north of us have dealt with directly as Our Lady of Lourdes Parish has now merged with St. Mary of the Lake Parish. Several dozen parishes in the Archdiocese of Chicago will close this year and the trend may not end for some time.

For me, it is like the death of a friend to see Saint Ignatius Parish close and similar to the death of a friend, it tends to put into perspective. As an adult, I cemented my commitment to live as a Christian at Saint Ignatius. That journey continues to this day and it does not die. The real trespass would be to disregard what the people, buildings, and parish of Saint Ignatius taught me. That is not closed, nor will it. To these more important spaces of our hearts, we should attach ourselves.

I would ask that you pray for all the faithful who have seen and continue to see closures to the parish communities that they once loved. Especially pray for that we may all continue to see God's ever-present grace that moves us past the grief, sorrows, and deaths we face and into the center of ourselves, where God dwells.

Be and Give a Blessing

It is common in the Catholic church to seek the blessing of a bishop, priest, or deacon. While many of these blessings are ecclesial or sacramental in nature (such as the baptism of a child), did you know that you can give blessings, too?

The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that "every baptized person is called to be a 'blessing' and to bless" (CCC, no. 1669). Through our baptism, we are called to participate in the universal priesthood. It is particularly appropriate for parents to bless their children, for caregivers to bless the sick for whom they care, for families to bless their homes, and for all of us to bless the food that nourishes our bodies.

Ah, perhaps that last one is familiar to you! Many Catholic families pray this blessing at meals:

Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts which we are about to receive from thy bounty through Christ our Lord. Amen.

There are many other blessings that are appropriate for a lay person (someone who is not ordained) to recite, both over objects and persons. A limited number of these blessings are available on the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' website. You can click here for blessings of objects, and click here for blessings of persons.

You can also purchase a copy of the *Catholic Household Book of Blessing and Prayers* to have in your home. Then it would be <u>very easy</u> to be and give a blessing!
