Pastoral Letter by Fr. Sergio Romo



"The good news of God-becominghuman is that we, the human race, are God's 'family of choice." Dear Friends,

I want to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Blessed Feast of the Holy Family! Every few years, we are blessed to have three consecutive days of celebrations, between Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and the Solemnity of the Holy Family with a common theme between all three days - **FAMILY**.

A project that I have worked on for many years has been researching my family's genealogy. Researching my ancestors and where my family came from has been a personally rewarding process. At the Vigil Mass on Christmas Eve, we hear Jesus's genealogy from Saint Matthew. It may seem an odd intrusion to us, having to get through the long recitation of names but recalling his ancestral line can be as rewarding as researching our own personal genealogies.

The genealogy of Jesus helps believers discover Jesus' importance through his ancestral line. Whereas I had to work backwards, researching my parent's parents, and their parents to know my genealogy, the genealogy of Jesus works forward, beginning with Abraham, the father of faith. From Abraham, to Isaac, to Jacob, and so on. The genealogy shows us that God vision is looking forward, not backward. In Jesus, God was born into a family that has a destination. Through Baptism, we are brought into that family lineage and we too have a destination, eternal life with God. It is important to remember that God's choice to enter into a family and to invite us into that same family originates in God, not us.

In recent years, the idea of a "family of choice" has become rather prevalent. Some believers witness a grace-filled presence of God's love radiating in their biological family. For others, the concept of a loving family may be harder to grasp, especially if the experiences of their own biological families were filled with tensions, hurt, estrangement, addiction, and even abuse. In such situations, people often seek out "families of choice" where they will be assured intimacy, care and support.

The good news of God-becoming-human is that we, the human race, are God's "family of choice." God came as a human not because God wanted to find intimacy, care and support, but rather God did this to ensure <u>WE</u> would find intimacy, care and support!

Parishes are also "families of choice." It used to be that people were just born into a geographical parish and that was that. Nowadays, people choose the parish they feel best addresses their spiritual needs. It is my prayer and hope that everyone who comes to Saint Andrew Parish, whether it be via an in-person Mass, or live-streamed Mass, or by way of a click on our e-bulletin, website or Facebook page, may experience the intimacy, care and support of our loving God born into the human family, as well as the love of the Saint Andrew Parish family.

However and with whomever you will celebrate these holy days, may they be warm and joyous filled with much love and peace. Merry Christmas!
