

Pastoral Letter by Deacon Eric Sorensen



"I said a Valentine
prayer for you
and asked the Lord
above
to fill your heart
and bless your soul
with the precious
gift of love."

My granddaughters have been busy. All excited, as they prepare their Valentine cards adorned with hearts and x's and o's. Of course, these cards are supposed to be a surprise. Still, they will be offered freely, as their gifts of love and joy, and perhaps, even wrapped in the innocence of a child. As Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." (Mt 19:14) Perhaps, a glimpse of heaven?

Saint Valentine is a third-century Roman saint widely celebrated on February 14, and commonly associated with "courtly love." Although not much of St. Valentine's life is reliably known, and whether or not the stories involve two different saints by the same name is also not officially decided. Yet, it is highly agreed that St. Valentine was martyred and then buried on the Via Flaminia to the north of Rome.

What is believed to be the first representation of St. Valentine was a Roman priest martyred during Claudius' reign. The story tells that St. Valentine was imprisoned for marrying Christian couples and aiding Christians being persecuted by Claudius in Rome. Another variation of the legend of St. Valentine says, while imprisoned he healed the jailer's blind daughter. On the day of his execution, he left the girl a note signed, "Your Valentine."

Still today, the holiday is widely recognized as a day for love, devotion and romance. We pray that it is celebrated in sincerity with giving hearts. Not hearts of stone, or made of paper, but hearts filled with joy, innocence and the love of God. For "the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us," so that we in turn may freely give his love ...and thus; witness a glimpse of heaven. (Rom 5:5)

So, as children of God, we freely offer this prayer for each other:

I said a Valentine prayer for you and asked the Lord above to fill your heart and bless your soul With the precious gift of love.

I asked Him for sincere love
The kind that's meant to stay
Just like the generous love
You give those you touch each day.

I prayed for love from family And from every cherished friend Then I asked the Lord to give you His love that knows no end. (catholic.org)

Well, I need to prepare myself by putting a surprised-look upon my face – – always eager to hear their cries of joy and glee, as the freely offer their gifts of love – – "Your Valentine."



The Sacraments

In *Living the Sacraments*, author Joe Paprocki describes the sacraments as "thin moments," significant opportunities when "we find ourselves encountering and keenly aware of the divine presence." Kathleen Hughes, RSJ, sees the sacraments as opportunities to "[hallow and celebrate] everyday experience, inviting us to deeper participation of the mystery of God with us."

When we celebrate a sacrament, we celebrate in a very tangible way the intangible God - we have a visible reminder of God's love for us. These are not the only moments when we encounter God, but they are moments when we can see and hear God acting directly through the sacramental rites to touch us, individually.

Take some time this week to contemplate how you live the sacraments daily.

Sacraments of Christian Initiation

(Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist)

- Do I put pressure on myself to be perfect or complete in God's eyes? Can I allow myself the grace to be "on the journey" of conversion?

Sacraments of Healing

(Penance and Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick)

 Am I holding back forgiveness and healing from those who I have hurt or who have hurt me? Do I practice the corporal works of mercy?

Sacraments of Service

(Matrimony, Holy Orders)

 Do I spend a great deal of time turning in toward myself and my own concerns? How am I serving others? Do I expect something in return? Do I graciously allow others to help me?
