Pastoral Letter by Father Sergio Romo, Pastor



"Locked doors are no match for the Holy Spirit; neither are locked hearts!" We really can't blame the disciples for how they reacted to Jesus' death on the cross. The thought that they might experience a similar fate seized them with great fear. In a desperate act of self-preservation, they locked themselves in a room. But more than that, they locked their hearts as well. The emotions they experienced were overwhelming and too painful. It was much easier for them to close themselves off, than to continue forward on the path of discipleship. And yet, in the midst of darkness, fear and grief, Jesus broke in offering them peace, reconciliation and the Holy Spirit.

The gift of the Holy Spirit was not limited to a singular event at Pentecost. Whenever we face our own cross in life, or find it difficult to forgive someone, or when grief and fear paralyze us, or whenever we are tempted to hide behind locked doors, the Holy Spirit finds a way into our lives. Locked doors are no match for the Holy Spirit; neither are locked hearts! Just as the disciples were transformed by the Holy Spirit, so too are we changed and compelled to live great lives of discipleship.

As we celebrate Pentecost, today, may the door to our hearts always be open to the movements of the Holy Spirit and may we even be inspired to throw away the key!"

Scripture Reflection by Deacon Eric Sorensen

I know that we often reflect on the future promise of eternal life. But are we aware of the present promise, the gift of the Father, to be "clothed with power from on high?" *Lk 24:49*. This weekend the *Workbook for Lectors* lists so many possible readings. It is like the Church could not decide which Scripture would best teach us about the Holy Spirit. We have heard of Jesus' Resurrection and Ascension. Now we hear that our Church, the faithful, initiated by Christ, has been *empowered* by the Holy Spirit on Pentecost.

Today, by the power of the Holy Spirit we, the faithful, "are all baptized into one body of Christ." Through the Spirit we receive "adoption, through whom we cry. 'Abba, Father!" With the Spirit we are encouraged to speak "of the mighty acts of God." "No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord,' except by the Holy Spirit."

Perhaps we expect the Spirit to descend as a strong driving wind with tongues of fire upon us, which would be convincing. But we have already received the Holy Spirit through our baptism. As Mary Magdalene of DePazzi said, "This

Spirit, dispenser of the treasures which lay in the lap of the Father, and guardian of the deliberations which pass between the Father and the Son, flows into the soul so sweetly and imperceptibly that few esteem its greatness." LOH, 1837.

We know of other Guardians of the Universe, who had to discern their own gifts of power, and realize their own courage to go forth for the good of the people. So it is with each of us, we are bestowed with heavenly gifts from our Father. Thus, we must take time to discern our own powers from on high. We too must allow the Spirit to encourage us, so sweetly and imperceptibly, to fulfill our call to be God's disciples in this present age, and not in a comic age.

Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit "bears witness with our spirits that we are children of God." And as "joint heirs with Christ," we are called to go forth and use our different spiritual gifts in different services working for the benefit of all. This allows us to fulfill the promise of the Father, and prepare us for the future promise of eternal life. When we are the heroes in this world, surely we will join with the saints in heaven.

From Easter to Pentecost

Pop quiz! Which season is longer: Lent or Easter?

You may be tempted to think it is Lent, especially if you gave up something particularly difficult this year. The answer? While Lent is 40 days long, the Easter season officially lasts for 50 days!

We see and hear these changes in the liturgy at mass: the deep purple vestments give way to bright white, the Gloria is sung again, and the bareness of the altar is covered in beautiful flowers

The Easter season does not end on the Ascension of our Lord (May 30). Jesus promised his disciples that he would send an "advocate," which is sometimes translated to "helper." This promise was the gift of the Holy Spirit, which instructs and guides us individually and as a church to grow in love and knowledge of God. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday (June 9), which officially concludes the season. But if the Holy Spirit is still with us, does Easter end? Maybe not.

Saint Augustine once said, "We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!" Truly, the Easter season never ends. We live every day in the hope of the Risen Christ, and share that joy with everyone around us. Happy Easter!

Do: Participate in a community garden or make your own windowsill nursery. Consider the gift of new growth and nurture God's creation.


