Pastoral Letter by Father Sergio Romo



"With the tenacity that is spoken about in the Word of God today, we vow to build up our parish community."

This summer, I observed a small child building a sand castle on a beach. Every now and then a wave would lap up on the shore and wash away a part of the castle. With each destructive wave, she proceeded to rebuild what she had lost. Never showing any frustration or discouragement, she persisted in her endeavor.

One hundred twenty-five years ago this week Archbishop Patrick Feehan granted the request of thirty-five families to start a new parish in Lakeview by appointing Fr. Andrew Croke as its first pastor. The first Mass at the newly founded Saint Andrew Parish was held in a hall on the corner of Lincoln Avenue and Roscoe Street. Fourteen months later, the first Saint Andrew Church, a wooden structure, was completed just in time for Christmas Mass.

With hearts filled with gratitude, today we give thanks to God for the faithful perseverance of those original 35 families and all the families in subsequent generations who helped to make Saint Andrew Parish what it is today, a place for believers to Gather, Learn, and Love. As the present stewards of this treasure we take the occasion of this milestone to commit ourselves to continue the legacy of our founding pastor and parishioners. With the tenacity that is spoken about in the Word of God today, we vow to build up our parish community, so that all may encounter Christ and grow in discipleship. Regardless of what the waves may bring, we stand ready to persist in this holy endeavor.

Scripture Reflection by Megan Daigle, Pastoral Ministry Asst.

Time for a reality check: Sometimes I that there is more in our scripture find it difficult to pray. Yes, there are days that I feel enveloped by the Holy Spirit, or completely in touch with scripture. I can speak to God with an open heart, and I feel that God responds to me with compassionate wisdom. I have plenty of traditional prayers at my disposal - I have a lot of "prayer muscles" I can flex in my spiritual exercises. That's not the issue.

To be perfectly honest, sometimes I am totally wiped out from hours (okay, maybe minutes) of what feels like a fruitless exercise. Is anyone listening? Nothing seems to be working. Is this worth it? Hello?

In every single reading this week, we hear that persistence is key. Keep you hands raised in prayer, like Moses. Keep asking for what you need, like the widow. Most of all, "be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient" (2 Tim 4:2).

"Great advice," you say, "but I've been at this for quite some time! Nothing seems to be working, and I feel like I am pounding on a brick wall. I'm not getting an answer, and I'm exhausted." The good news is

than just, "Keep at it."

We hear that Moses held his hands up, but he also put them down... because he's human! He was tired! It wasn't possible for Moses to keep his hands raised up long enough for Joshua to win the war. So what happened? Two people stepped in to support Moses. He accepted their help, because he knew he couldn't do it alone.

In the gospel, Jesus tells us to call out to God continuously. He doesn't say, "Speak up once or twice, my Father will answer." He anticipates that we may be calling out for quite a while. Continuous, persistent prayer is important, but it's also difficult. We can't do it alone.

If we pray in the company of others, we strengthen our prayer. Seek out those people in your life who are an Aaron or a Hur, and remember that you can be that person for others. Maybe that's what I'm lacking when I feel like giving up - maybe I am putting too much pressure on myself to do it by myself. I need others to help me lift my hands. Do you?

Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families Life and Dignity of the Human Person

Visit the website of the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, and you will quickly see that October is Respect Life month. The phrase "from conception to natural death" may be a familiar one to you, and while moral issues surrounding birth and death are important to address, we sometimes make the mistake of neglecting the "to" of that phrase. What happens in the space between our beginning and end, when we are faced with the decisions of how we choose to *live* our lives?

Recognizing the value of life and the dignity of each person we meet is the foundational principle for all Catholic social teaching. Care for the environment, our responsibilities, fair access to jobs, family and community, working for equality, and the inclusion of poor and marginalized people... all of these concepts flow from the basic idea that human life is precious.

What this means for us is that we hold as precious each and every life God creates: A sister living with disabilities. A co-worker diagnosed with a terminal illness. A teenager addicted to drugs or alcohol. Our neighbors. Strangers. Each person is holy and valuable beyond measure, and should be celebrated as such. We are also more powerful than we know, because we can lift up in thanksgiving and praise each life we encounter if we choose to see others as God sees us.

Make plans in March for our Parish Mission with Saint Benedict Parish




