# Pastoral Letter by Deacon Mark Purdome



We're called to
engage the world,
to encounter a
world that might
be a little
challenging, and
spread God's good
news from within.

Make no mistake, sheep have a distinctive smell.

In 2013, not long after his elevation to Pope, Francis first mentioned what has become one of the most defining phrases for our Holy Father: to be a successful missionary church, we need to smell like the sheep. Initially, he called upon priests to reach out to everyone in need, to stay close to the marginalized and to be "shepherds living with the smell of the sheep." Later, he expanded that call to the entire church. But how do we do that, in a city like Chicago, where we are most likely to encounter sheep in a zoo?

Since we're not likely shepherds, or even farmers, I think we tend to idealize sheep. They're gentle creatures who stay in a flock in order to protect themselves, since they don't have a lot of natural defenses against predators. They've been important to humans for thousands of years, providing milk and wool to help us survive. And while sheep have a reputation for being dumb, they're actually pretty smart, with excellent hearing and the ability to identify and remember individual members of their flock. Plus, they're cute, especially when they are babies.

But they do have a distinct smell.

Pope Francis uses this metaphor to remind us that our role as Christians is not to isolate ourselves in the Church, barring the doors to the outside world. Rather than becoming self-protecting, self-referential, and withdrawn, our mission is to engage with the world, to embrace the people around us both with all of our commonality and with all of our differences. To not be afraid to be part of the world around us.

I am sometimes tempted to live in what I conceive as an ideal world: one where everyone agrees with me, where we all get along, get enough sleep, and are always pleasant. But when you think about it, that ideal world would, by necessity, be completely isolating - in order to always get along, to always be pleasant, I wouldn't be able to interact with anyone else, at least not if I allow them to be themselves. And that is exactly the opposite of what Jesus, and Pope Francis, call us to do. Instead, we're called to live in community just like a flock of sheep. With all of the frustrations, debates, and differing points of view. Because when we're together, even with all of the mess, we are truly the people of God, and that makes us better as a whole.

So our task is not just to hang out with people who look like us, who think like us, or who believe like us. Instead, we're called to engage the world, to encounter a world that might be a little challenging, and spread God's good news from within.

# Learn at Home, for Individuals & Families

#### The Easter Season

Pop quiz! Which season is longer: Lent or Easter? Most of us are familiar with the 40 days of Lent, and might think that Easter only lasts one day. But the Easter season officially lasts 50 days!

When we are gathered for mass, we see and hear these changes in the liturgy: the deep purple vestments give way to bright white, the Gloria is sung again, and the bareness of the altar would be covered in beautiful flowers. These signs tell us Jesus is risen!

The Easter season does not end with Jesus' return to heaven, on the Ascension of our Lord. He promised his disciples that he would send an "advocate," which is sometimes translated to "helper." This promise was the gift of the Holy Spirit, which instructs and guides us individually and as a church to grow in love and knowledge of God. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday, which officially concludes the season. (That's this weekend!)

But if the Holy Spirit is still with us, does Easter really end? Maybe not. Saint Augustine once said, "We are an Easter people, and Alleluia is our song!"

#### At Home with Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35)

The gospel story of the Road to Emmaus provides us with ways to celebrate the Easter season. We can...

- ... read the Old Testament, and discover the scripture Jesus "opened" to the disciples. Try Dt 18:15, Psalm 22:1-18, and Isaiah 53
- ... go for a walk. Invite Jesus to meet you on the road, especially if your heart feels heavy.
- ... bake bread; Jesus revealed himself in the breaking of it. <u>Here are 50 quick breads</u>. Hey! That's one for every day of Easter!
